Counselor's Corner by Mrs. Patty Goes

It's time to prepare for the FAFSA if your son/daughter is planning to attend college in the Fall of 2016.

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is for state, federal and college-specific financial aid. Even if you don't think you'll qualify for need-based financial aid, you should complete the FAFSA to qualify for low-interest student and parent loans.

Follow these steps to prepare for, and complete, the FAFSA and the financial aid process:

Contact the college(s) you applied to and ask for their FAFSA priority filing date. Some types of financial aid are awarded first-come, first-served, so submit the FAFSA before that date.

Complete your 2015 taxes early as the FAFSA requires current tax information.

Gather student and parent items: Check the EducationQuest website for a list.

Be prepared to answer the following FAFSA question:

Did you or anyone in your household receive any of the following federal benefits?

- * Supplemental Security Income
- * Food Stamps
- * TANF
- * Free or Reduced Price Lunch
- * WIC

Complete and file the FAFSA electronically at fafsa.gov before your college's priority date.

Expect a Student Aid Report acknowledging that your form was processed.

Expect Financial Aid Award Notifications in the spring from the colleges you listed on your FAFSA. The notifications will detail the financial aid assistance the colleges are offering (could be a combination of scholarships, work-study and student loans).

Apply for student and parent loans (if necessary) in the summer through your college.

All students in Grades 7-11 will be registering for 2016-17 classes in late January. Parents will need to sign their request sheet before we can enter the class requests into the computer system.

Seniors and their families should be watching every possibility for scholarships if they are planning to attend college. Mrs. Goes has many listed on the Southern Schools web page. It is listed under High School staff pages.

The end of first semester is quickly approaching and the talk of preparing for state tests becomes an everyday discussion. For your calendar needs, grades 4, 8 and 11 will take the state writing test during the timeframe of January 18 - February 5. Grades 3 - 8 and 11 will take the reading and math tests during

timeframe of March 21 - May 6. Grades 5- 8, and 11 will also take a science test during this time.

All classrooms are preparing for these tests as well as learning the necessary curriculum to prepare for life after high school. Everyone can help prepare our young people for these tests and life after high school. Talk to them about your career and share your responsibilities. Talk to them about how education builds a foundation for life long learning. It takes all adults in our young people's lives to build their assets for a healthy, caring and responsible life. Thank you for your efforts and may you and your family enjoy time together. Merry Christmas!


